World War II Guest Veterans

George Sutcliffe – A JABO Angels Pilot of the 379th Squadron, 368th Fighter Group, who flew 80 missions in P-47's and P-51's over Europe. He can be seen on the History Channel's Dogfight DVD season two on the Thunderbolt disk. George talks about his June 14, 1944 experience against outnumbering Me-109 fighters on the way back from a mission.

Julius Cobb – B-17 Lead Bombardier of the 91st Heavy Bomb Group, 8th Air Force. Julie is credited with 30 daytime missions over Europe in 1944 and 1945. Talk to him about some of the worst missions he encountered for fighter opposition at Mersburg, Ruhr Valley, Berlin, Munich and especially Leipzig, where most of the squadron was lost on August 8, 1944. Extremely heavy and accurate flak was encountered at Hamburg, Bremen, Munich, the whole Ruhr Valley (nicknamed Flak Alley), Berlin and Cologne.

Joseph Cosenzo – Took part in the Normandy landings on Omaha Beach - Day One with the 1st Signal Corps, 1st Infantry Division. He was under constant enemy fire as he ran communication lines all along Omaha Beach. Joseph was awarded the Bronze Star with Distinction. He was in five major campaigns from France through Germany. Speak to Joseph about his responsibilities and the American landings at Bloody Beach Omaha and the European Campaign.

Vietnam War Guest Veterans

Robert Cuce was drafted in 1969 and eventually assigned to E Battery 41st Artillery where he saw a Quad 50 for the first time on a specially converted Five Ton trucks. Trained as a gunner, he was stationed at An Khe in the Central Highlands, and at "Oasis" a small firebase west of Pleiku just inside of the Cambodian border, and Tuy Hoa along the Vietnam coast, and Dong Ba Thin (north of Cam Ranh Bay) supporting the 5th Special Forces and an aviation helicopter unit, and a small unnamed fire base south west of Cam Ranh Bay supporting the 101st Airborne. This entailed virtually every military section of Vietnam except for the southernmost "Delta" or IV Corp.
